

April 5, 2009

Thanks!**
- A warm welcome to Richard Knoblock, who has re-joined the chapter after being away a few years.
- Announced birthdays, anniversaries, and those members we need to keep in our prayers.
- Lenny and Phyllis Major still have club shirts for sale. Keep in mind that members and spouses can each buy a shirt at the club-subsidized price of \$15. Additional shirts are \$30.
- Alan Ziglin gave us some information about the City of Dunwoody 4th of July parade. This will be the largest parade in Georgia for the holiday, running about 2.5 miles along Mt. Vernon Road (same road as the February meeting location). There will be three staging areas set up, and we should plan on arriving in the 8-8:30 A.M. time frame before the roads begin to close. Parade start time is 9:30 A.M. We will let you know once the city has set up a website for the parade.

Motion to join the parade as an official club event was made, seconded, and approved by the members present. This will be a fun way to support International Drive Your Studebaker Day.

If you are interested in entering a car in the parade, please contact Alan and Rochelle Ziglin at 770.399.0694, or let Chris Collins know. We will have more details and request a firm headcount as we get closer to July. Also, if anyone has media contacts through which we could generate some publicity for our club's participation, let us know that as well.

- Ed Burris reports that allowing non-Studebaker vehicles to join zone meets on a display-only basis is being considered by the Florida chapters. Ed attended the Middle Tennessee Chapter show this weekend. About 31 very nice cars were there, including Ed's 1964 Avanti, which won a First Place award!
- Carolyn Sikes raised the idea of the chapter buying some removable signs with our logo. We could place those signs on the lead car when we are in parades, and during other meetings we could put them on a car that is particularly visible to passers-by. Charlotte Delli will research the cost of having such publicity tools made.
- Wayne Lee reminded members of the Southeastern Zone Meet taking place May 15-17 in Townsend, Tennessee. The 32nd Annual Florida State Meet will be held October 30-31 in Deland (between Orlando and Daytona Beach). While sponsorship for the 2010 Zone Meet has not been set, South Georgia is taking on 2011 and the Orlando chapter is considering 2012.
- Dan mentioned that SDC National is considering a proposal that vehicle judging on the show field be optional (with a new display-only alternative) for meet entrants.

This is a 99 page book based on the articles of the same name that appeared in *Turning Wheels* in the early 1990s and which won the SDC's Churchill Award for Best Article, Non-Paid. The book contains all the material from the original series, which ran for a year and a half in *The Hillholder*, and not only replaces some material edited out for the *TW* series, but has updates and several new items that were written after the *TW* series was published.

"Some Thoughts" is aimed at the first-time restorer, but will be of value to the more experienced; it doesn't try to be a "how to restore a car book", but gives you a look at the decision-making processes, tools, spaces and basic skills you'll need to do a restoration, and will provide a framework to help you structure your project.

There are several chapters of Studebaker-specific advice. In the chapter devoted to engine rebuilding, I've tried to describe a step-by-step process that anybody can follow, and I've tried to include tips I've picked up in building 60+ engines. I've received many compliments on the engine chapter, and I'm glad to finally be able to get it in print.
