Meeting Minutes

February 7, 2010

- President Dan Miller opened the meeting. Thanks to Alan Ziglin for again hosting us at Granny Smith's Buffet in Dunwoody.
- Announced birthdays, anniversaries, and those we need to keep in our thoughts and prayers. Thomas Odom's father passed away on January 28th. Deborah Jones of Bethlehem passed away on February 4th. She and her staff from A Taste of Class Catering took good care of us during many of our Christmas party meetings.
- 2010 Southeast Zone Meet:

The plan is to conduct our meet on Friday through Sunday, October 8-10. This is the weekend after the Petit Le Mans at Road Atlanta. It is the only weekend we found that neither conflicts with a major neighboring SDC meet, nor gets too far into the autumn season.

Dan and Barbara met with the management of our proposed host hotel. Located off I-85 in Braselton (exit 126, near Chateau Elan), the Country Inn and Suites by Carlson opened last year. This is a 100% non-smoking facility, with approximately 80 rooms overlooking a 4-story indoor atrium. There are 3-4 rooms on the first floor for disabled guests. The banquet room will accommodate up to 90 people, and we can set up additional tables in the lobby and food service areas if needed.

We need to contact the owner of the adjacent building (not part of the hotel property) to see if we can use their parking lot to stage vehicles for the show. The hotel does have a paved patio on which vendors can set up, but vehicles cannot be driven on it.

If the chapter guarantees 50 room nights, our daily rate will be \$79.00 per night, plus taxes. Our block of rooms will cover Thursday, Friday, and Saturday night guests.

We circulated a sign-up sheet so members can volunteer to help organize and conduct the meet. Dan and Barbara have agreed to be meet co-chairs. We'll want to have the ideas and involvement of as many members as possible: it takes a lot of coordinated effort to bring about successful meets as we have offered to our visitors in past years.

- Although not with us today, Marvin and Carolyn Sikes sent word that we are invited to tour the Milton Robson Museum near Gainesville on Saturday May 22nd, at 10:00 AM. Along with the SDC, other groups invited include the Cadillac-LaSalle, Jaguar, and Thunderbird clubs. The Hudson-Essex-Terraplane, Lincoln and Continental, and Packard organizations are tentative attendees. Those who toured Mr. Robson's collection two years ago found it to be a treat for the eyes. More information and directions will be in a future *Hillholder*.
- Ed Burris and Wayne Lee have been re-elected as SDC Board Member and Southeast Zone Coordinator, respectively. We are most thankful for their continued dedication and service to our club. Wayne had an updated list of future SDC events; we will list them in *The Hillholder*.
- Charlotte Delli presented highlights from the Treasurer's Report; the full report will also be in the newsletter.
- Bill Delli reports that 47 members have renewed, leaving 17 yet to pay their 2010 chapter dues. Two new members joined this year: Melvin Bohannon and Suzana Williams of Marietta. The aircraft is an EA-6A, an electronic warfare (radar jamming) version of the Grumman A-6 Intruder bomber, which was used by the Marines in Vietnam. The car is, of course, a 1956 Sky Hawk, which seems fitting for a combat pilot!

My friend Ken Thomas, who flew them, tells me: "I am told that car and driver's picture is then Lt Col Tom Murphree CO [of VM CJ-2, a Marine EA-6A squadron,] circa 65-66 when the EA-6As first came on board. According to one account his maintenance guys painted it up while he was away on a cross-country [flight]."

I think most of the "artwork" is adhesive decals, not paint. Note the typical rust in the lower rear of the front fender.





STUDEBAKER MEDIA



This is a 99 page book based on the articles of the same name that appeared in *Turning Wheels* in the early 1990s and which won the SDC's Churchill Award for Best Article, Non-Paid. The book contains all the material from the original series, which ran for a year and a half in *The Hillholder*, and not only replaces some material edited out for the *TW* series, but has updates and several new items that were written after the *TW* series was published.

"Some Thoughts" is aimed at the first-time restorer, but will be of value to the more experienced; it doesn't try to be a "how to restore a car book", but gives you a look at the decision-making processes, tools, spaces and basic skills you'll need to do a restoration, and will provide a framework to help you structure your project.


There are several chapters of Studebaker-specific advice. In the chapter devoted to engine rebuilding, I've tried to describe a step-by-step process that anybody can follow, and I've tried to include tips I've picked up in building 60+ engines. I've received many compliments on the engine chapter, and I'm glad to finally be able to get it in print.

Some Thoughts on Restoring a Studebaker is available for \$22.50 USD, plus \$4 for handling and postage, for a total of \$26.50 to US addresses. Canadian orders add \$6.50 USD for postage, total \$29.00 USD. To order a second book in the same order, add an additional \$3 (\$4 USD for Canadian orders). For Australia and Europe, shipping is \$12, total \$34.50 USD paid by PayPal only.
