

- We welcomed our visitors and guests, and announced birthdays, anniversaries, and those we need to keep in our thoughts and prayers. On behalf of the whole chapter, Dan extended our condolences to Chuck Lampman, whose grandson passed away recently.
- Barbara Miller gave a Southeast Zone Meet update:
 - We have 27 meet registrations to date, with 54 room-nights reserved, thus exceeding our minimum room commitment to the hotel. The hotel will keep our block of rooms available after Sept. 15, in order to accommodate as many people as possible at our special rate.
 - Two registrations are from South Georgia chapter members (excluding North Georgia members who belong to both).
 - We need donations of snacks, soft drinks, finger sandwiches, etc. to have in the hospitality room on Friday and Saturday.  - A group of us will get together within the next couple of weeks to assemble the goody bags. We will ask for some volunteers to help once we finalize the date.
 - We have selected a food vender to serve hamburgers and hot dogs in the show area on Saturday. For \$5.00, you can get a hamburger or two hot dogs, plus chips and a drink. Our vendor comes well-recommended and caters a large number of events.

- Wayne Lee brought a supply of the new SDC color brochures for us to share with prospective club members.
- Tom Elliott reports that a R-2 Studebaker Avanti with about 10,000 miles will be coming to the meet from Illinois. Sounds like a good opportunity for Avanti owners to see an authentic example as a guideline for our own maintenance and restoration work.

Studebaker National Museum's 2010 Car Raffle



This is a 99 page book based on the articles of the same name that appeared in *Turning Wheels* in the early 1990s and which won the SDC's Churchill Award for Best Article, Non-Paid. The book contains all the material from the original series, which ran for a year and a half in *The Hillholder*, and not only replaces some material edited out for the *TW* series, but has updates and several new items that were written after the *TW* series was published.

"Some Thoughts" is aimed at the first-time restorer, but will be of value to the more experienced; it doesn't try to be a "how to restore a car book", but gives you a look at the decision-making processes, tools, spaces and basic skills you'll need to do a restoration, and will provide a framework to help you structure your project.

There are several chapters of Studebaker-specific advice. In the chapter devoted to engine rebuilding, I've tried to describe a step-by-step process that anybody can follow, and I've tried to include tips I've picked up in building 60+ engines. I've received many compliments on the engine chapter, and I'm glad to finally be able to get it in print.
