

Our August Chapter Meeting to be held at Ft Yargo State Park in Winder, GA. Balloons will mark the entrance, \$2 parking fee.


Our traditional picnic will again be held at our in-door facility located at Ft. Yargo State Park in Winder, GA, hosted by the Careys and Hunts.

Some Thoughts on Restoring a Studebaker by Chuck Lampman

In 1988 through 1990, while editing *The Hillholder*, the newsletter of the North Georgia Chapter of the Studebaker Drivers Club, I wrote a series of articles that tried to capture what I had learned about restoration of these cars and trucks that we love. In the early 1990s they were published in edited form as a series in *Turning Wheels*, the monthly magazine of the SDC. In fact they won the SDC's Churchill Award for Best Article by a non-paid writer. After many requests I have finally pulled all the material together into book form, replaced some material which had been edited out for space reasons in the *Turning Wheels* versions, and updated much of it to reflect some of the changes that technology has been brought to the art of restoring a motor vehicle. This is NOT a "how-to-restore-a-car" book, there are already plenty of those out there. This book attempts to step back a little and address some of the larger questions and decisions that go into the process, to provide a framework for intelligently approaching the restoration, and to pass on some of the things the author has learned in restoring five Studebakers. We won't get into too much intricate detail, since that information is usually found in the shop manuals; we will, however, take a very close look at rebuilding the Studebaker engine, with emphasis on the V-8.




President's Message:
