DELMONICO'S RESTAURANT

—DIRECTIONS Delmonico's Restaurant is a place that on Sunday serves all you can eat home cooking served family style. Usually two or three meats, an assortment of vegetables, breads, and desserts are delivered to your table. You are able to tell the waiter what refills you would like to have. The price of each meal is \$10.95. Drinks are extra. The dining area will be in a private setting. The restaurant is located at 118 North Wayne Street, Monroe, Georgia 30655. It is located in the Downtown District on the adjacent back street between North Highland and Spring Street. From Hwy.78 exit onto Hwy. 11 (Main Street) go south into the Historic District. Turn right on to Highland Ave. at the intersection just past St. Albans Episcopal Church & Monroe Utilities' Building; immediately turn left onto North Wayne Street. Delmonico's is located on the left. Parking is in front of the building or across the street. The telephone number for 678-247-3718.

Country-style dining was enjoyed by our members in June at Delmonico's Restaurant in Monroe. The food is brought to your table and you pass the bowls around. A nice, private room was set up so we could dine and visit and then have a meeting without interruption or noise from other guests. Delmonico's seems an ideal place to have more than one meeting for the club since the atmosphere, price, food and service is good.






President's Message:


