President's Message

Last month I challenged you to start winter projects on your Studebakers. Hopefully you have at least thought about a project. I did start a project on my high mileage 37 Dictator. Actually I completed a project, but when I took a test drive a couple of additional items turned up. Those of you that have seen my car will know that I will not live long enough to complete it but will hopefully will be able to keep it on the road.

My project was the loose steering on my car. I bought the car 51 years ago and I have been steering it continuously when on a straight road every since. I tried to adjust the screw on top of the steering box to no avail. I didn't worry about it too much because there were so many other things to do on the car, that as long as I could keep it on the road I concentrated on those things. I did not have a service manual for it until recently. After consulting the manual, I noticed that the steering could be adjusted by removing a shim from under the cap holding the steering shaft to the steering gear box. I got the four bolts loose on the end cap and loosened the steering tube inside the car to slide the shaft back about 1/8 inch. That exposed the shims and I removed one 4 or 5 mil shim. I tightened the cap, and like magic there was no longer play in the steering wheel.

When starting for the aforementioned test drive, it cranked way too long. That reminded me that I had intended to replace the points. The steering was great on the test drive, but when I stopped at a stop sign, I was reminded that I had driven a couple miles with the E-brake applied on my last outing. The brake pedal was near the floor and the brakes need adjusting. So I have a couple of other details to work on before spring cruising season, along with whatever turns up from test drives after those projects.

Recipe Corner - Navy Bean and Ham Soup

Ingredients: 2 cups dried navy beans
 1/3 cup vegetable oil
 2 cloves garlic, minced
 2 large onions, chopped
 1/4 teaspoon thyme
 One 5.5 ounce can V-8
 Juice Or 14.5 oz can stewed tomatoes

Pepper to taste
 Boiling water as needed
 1 1/2 lbs chopped ham
 1 1/2 tablespoons lemon juice
 2 tablespoons fresh parsley, minced
 Or 2 teaspoons dried parsley
 1 1/2 teaspoons salt (or to taste)

Wash beans and soak overnight in cold water. Drain and rinse.

Heat the oil in a large kettle or Dutch oven. Saute the garlic and onions until clear. Add the beans, thyme, V-8 juice or stewed tomatoes, salt and pepper. Cover with enough water to come 2 inches above the beans.

Bring to boil and lower the heat. Cover and cook slowly about 1 to 1 1/2 hours. Add the chopped ham and continue cooking until the beans are very soft about another hour to 1 1/2 hours.

To thicken, remove about 1 pint of beans and mash. Return to the kettle along with the lemon juice and parsley. Cook about 5 minutes longer. Makes 8 servings.





SOME THOUGHTS ON RESTORING A STUDEBAKER

Written by Chuck Lampman, this 99-page book is based on articles written by Chuck Lampman, North Georgia Chapter SDC member, that appeared in *Turning Wheels* in the early 1990's and won the SDC Churchill Award for Best Article, Non-paid. Some material edited out of *Turning Wheels* is included in the book as well as updates and several new items written after the *Turning Wheels* series was published. "Some Thoughts" is aimed at the first time restorer but will be of value to the more experienced. It is not intended to be a "how to restore" book but gives a look at the decision-making processes, tools, spaces, and basic skills needed to do a restoration. It also provides a framework to help structure a project and contains several chapters of Studebaker-specific advice.
