Installing Disc Brake Pads

By the time a car needs to have new disc brake pads, there may be a band of rust at the outer rim of the rotor. If present, this band will vary in width from car to car. The rust is formed on the area of the rotor that has not been wiped by the pads during braking and is nothing to worry about. On the rusted area, will also be sand aand grit.

When installing the new pads, it is important that the pads be spread out far enough from the rotor o that will not contact the rusted area of the rotor before being bolted in place. If rust is present between the pads and the rotors, there will be squeaking when the brakes area applied to stop or slow the car. There is also a gel available from parts jobbers that can be applied to the back of the pads before installing them to help stop the squeaking.

Aside from vibration that causes squeaking, there could also be a mouse caught in the rotor as shown in the pictures below. It is the same mouse in both photos. Its work is done and its squeaking days are over.


The October 2018 meeting of the North Georgia SDC will take place at the Olive Garden restaurant in Smyrna.



SOME THOUGHTS ON RESTORING A STUDEBAKER

Written by Chuck Lampman, this 99-page book is based on articles written by Chuck Lampman, North Georgia Chapter SDC member, that appeared in *Turning Wheels* in the early 1990's and won the SDC Churchill Award for Best Article, Non-paid. Some material edited out of *Turning Wheels* is included

in the book as well as updates and several new items written after the Turning Wheels series was published. "Some Thoughts" is aimed at the first-time restorer but will be of value to the more experienced. It is not intended to be a "how to restore" book but gives a look at the decision-making processes, tools, spaces, and basic skills needed to do a restoration. It also provides a framework to help structure a project and contains several chapters of Studebaker-specific advice.
