

A Proposal to Change Club Meeting Frequency



SOME THOUGHTS ON RESTORING A STUDEBAKER

Written by Chuck Lampman, this 99-page book is based on articles written by Chuck Lampman, North Georgia Chapter SDC member, that appeared in *Turning Wheels* in the early 1990's and won the SDC Churchill Award for Best Article, Non-paid. Some material edited out of *Turning Wheels* is included

in the book as well as updates and several new items written after the Turning Wheels series was published. "Some Thoughts" is aimed at the first-time restorer but will be of value to the more experienced. It is not intended to be a "how to restore" book but gives a look at the decision-making processes, tools, spaces, and basic skills needed to do a restoration. It also provides a framework to help structure a project and contains several chapters of Studebaker-specific advice.

Important Museum Announcement on the 1931 Studebaker Indy Car


Yesterday (June 25, 2019) the Studebaker National Museum Board of Trustees at their monthly meeting made the decision to pursue acquisition of the 1931 Studebaker Indy Car. This car, as you know, is being sold at the Gooding Auction being held in Monterey CA. on August 16-17. 2019. https://www.goodingco.com/vehicle/1931-studebaker-special-indy-car/

This is probably the most important Studebaker vehicle sold in this country in the past 50 years and is expected to be one of the highlights of this Gooding sale. The sale of this vehicle will no doubt set the record for the highest price of a Studebaker ever sold.

With this said, the Board of Trustees, pledged and committed a significant amount of funds for this purchase. However, they do not believe that at this time they have accumulated enough to actually purchase this car.

There is a **RESERVE** on the car which is unknown and that is part of the problem along with the fact that many of these type vehicles are being purchased by overseas buyers and also that none of the other Studebaker Indy cars are available for purchase on the open market. To my knowledge this is the first time one of these cars has crossed the auction block.

The Museum Board has asked me to post this to the Forum where many SDC members, friends of Studebakers and others can see it, and ask for your help in bringing this car home to South Bend. I have made a significant pledge to assist in the Museum's efforts to acquire this car. Now I am asking you to join me, the members of the Board of Trustees and friends of the Museum to help us bring this car back to South Bend.



At this time, the Museum <u>does not want Checks, Money Orders or Cash</u> for this project. What they want is a **PLEDGE**.
