What's In Our Garage?

Our detached garage is a 50-foot by 35-foot structure measuring over 16 feet high at its peak. The roll-up doors are extra wide and extra tall - about 16 feet tall and 14 feet wide. We currently have five vehicles parked inside, but there is room for about three more if we should want to add to the collection. The building is heated and cooled, and it has a half-bath.

Here are the machines that lie behind those doors in "chronological" order:



1953 DeSoto Firedome four-door sedan. All-original 276 c.i. "hemi" V8 engine. We bought the car several years ago in Montgomery, AL. It drove nicely but had nothing but torn pieces of cloth for upholstery and no headliner whatsoever. The new interior, including headliner, was installed by Billy and Charleen Carey using new, genuine NOS 1953 DeSoto material that we were fortunate enough to find from a vendor in New England.

1956 Ford Mainline 2-door sedan. A very pretty "plain Jane" car with a 223-c.i. inline-6-cylinder engine and three-on-the-tree manual transmission. Tim bought the car in Covington, GA, and has owned it for about 40 years now. It has no rust and the interior is flawless.





1960 Studebaker Champ pick-up. We foolishly bought this vehicle on e-Bay about 15 years ago without ever seeing or driving it. But we were lucky because it turned out to be a gem. It is rust-free and runs extremely well. The seller was in Amarillo, Texas, so we trailered it to Georgia from there. It has a Studebaker 259 V8 engine and a three-on-the-tree manual transmission with automatic overdrive. Actual mileage is just over 40,000. No power options, and steering this vehicle in tight spaces keeps Tim's arms in pretty good shape!

1985 Chevy G20 custom van. Tim inherited this vehicle from his mother shortly after his father died in 1990. With a 305 V8 engine, it is a workhorse that we use to pull the car-hauling trailer, among other things. It has plenty of Wisconsin rust along with some bumps and bruises, but it runs nicely thanks to a rebuilt engine and transmission that were installed around 20 years ago.





1999 Chevy Astro van. We bought this vehicle at CarMax when it was just a couple years old. Back in 2006, we took it on vacation to upstate New York and had a few minor problems with it, so we decided that since it had well over 100,000 miles, maybe we should get a newer, more dependable vehicle for long trips. So we bought a Honda Odyssey for that purpose. Now the Astro has nearly 270,000 miles and runs as well as it did the day we bought it. We use it for occasional hauling and for getting from home to the Silver Comet Trail and back for our bicycle rides. Not sure whether this vehicle will ever die but its longevity amazes us.





"Some Thoughts" is aimed at the first-time restorer but will be of value to the more experienced. It is not intended to be a "how to restore" book but gives a look at the decision-making processes, tools, spaces, and basic skills needed to do a restoration. It also provides a framework to help structure a project and contains several chapters of Studebaker-specific advice.
